- 2. Consider the three "Check Points" that were shared during this message:

What is the significance of these "Check Points" and why is it important for us to understand/remember each of them?

- 1. We all share one sin in common: Fault in what we say before God (James 1:2)
- 2. Our tongues are small but can steer the entire course of our lives and impact others greatly.
- 3. God made humans in His image; we cannot tear each other down with our words.
- 3. How does Ephesians 4:29 (the passage shared for the benediction) remind us of how we are to use our tongues?

Why Should We Battle The Tongue?

- 1. Our most dangerous weapon!
- 2. Our testimony to non-believers!

Psalm 51:14 - Then I will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you.

3. God commands it!

James 4:17 - If anyone, then, knows the good they ought to do and doesn't do it, it is sin for them. 2 Corinthians 5:17 - If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

As you consider the following "How to" statements - what steps is the Lord calling you to take next to grow in this area? How Should We Battle The Tongue?

1. Have a Right Heart with God!

Psalm 51:10 - Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.

1 Peter 5:8 - the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.

- 2. Discernment in the Holy Spirit!
- 3. Deliberate Effort to Gain Biblical Wisdom!

James 1:19 - Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry. Colossians 4:2 - Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful.

- 4. Pause before we speak...OR POST! OR TEXT!
- 5. Remember who we represent!
- 6. Speak from a position of love instead of dissent!
