FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION

God With Us - Philippians 4:4-9 - "The Peace of God"

- 1. Is there anything specific from this message that the Lord has impressed upon your heart? If so, what is it & how do you feel the Lord calling you to respond?
- 2. Have you ever experienced peace the midst of really challenging circumstances in your life?

 What was the situation and how were you able to find peace in the midst of such circumstances?

 How do Jesus' words in John 14:27 provide a distinction between the peace He gives & the peace the world gives?
- 3. Read Philippians 4:4-5; why do you think this section that turns toward God's peace begins with the command to rejoice? The following statement was shared in light of the command to rejoice always:

For the Christian, "Rejoicing always" is not a denial of reality; it is actually evidence of a greater understanding of reality!

How does rejoicing relate to reasonableness (gentleness) toward all others & maintaining peace in the Lord?

How does remembering that "The Lord is at hand" better help us and motivate us to obey this command?

- 4. Read Philippians 4:6-7; what is commanded in verse 6, and what is the result if obeyed as stated in verse 7? Where else do you see the idea of anxiety/worry addressed in the Scriptures? What difference does thanksgiving make as we're called to present our requests to God? Based upon this, when are we supposed to give thanks to the Lord, and why does that matter in this context? How does the peace of God truly surpass all understanding, and how does it guard our hearts and minds in Christ?
- 5. Read Philippians 4:8-9; what is the promised result if we put into practice the commands in these verses?

 Consider all that we're called to think about in verse 8; how does what you're thinking about align with these words?

 If you're struggling to think rightly, what should you start doing, keep doing, or stop doing to think rightly?

 How does putting these commands into practice result in (& reveal) the God of peace being with us?
