On Mission – Romans 1:1-17 - “Our Gospel Mission” - 04.07.2024

1. Is there anything specific from this message that the Lord has impressed upon your heart?
If so, what is it & how do you feel the Lord calling you to respond?
2. As you read Romans 1:1-17, What stands out to you about these verses and how do they relate specifically to living On Mission: Our Gospel Mission?
3. In Romans 1:1, Paul says that he has been “set apart for the gospel of God.” What is the gospel (1 Corinthians 15:1-4)? Is the gospel just for the unbeliever who does not know Jesus or is the gospel needed for believers as well?
4. We see in Romans 1 that Paul describes himself as a “servant of Christ Jesus” but that wasn’t always the case. In Acts 9: 1-22 we read the account of Saul (who became known as Paul) encounter Jesus and was changed by the truth of the gospel.
 - Has the gospel changed you? If so, how? Share your story.
5. As followers of Jesus the gospel changed our mission. What is our mission as a follower of Jesus, as a family, as a church?
 - We will look at this more on Sunday but, do we live as a missionary to our communities in which we live, work, and play?
6. In Romans 1:12, Paul mentions “that we may be mutually encouraged by each other’s faith”.
 - How can we encourage one another as we are “On Mission” for God together?
 - What are a few examples of how you have you encouraged or been encouraged?
7. How does the gospel display the power of God in salvation (Romans 1:16)?
 - What part of living “On Mission” do we need to give to God and not try to do by our own power?
 - What does it look like to live by faith in your life (Romans 1:17)?
